Dr. Heather Wittenberg is a psychologist with more than 25 years of experience conducting over 1,200 complex psychological evaluations for legal, medical, educational, and governmental agencies. She has completed these assessments across family, civil, school, healthcare, and administrative-court settings, including Workers' Compensation Independent Medical Evaluations (IMEs/IPEs), Child Welfare Services evaluations, educational, competency and custody-related matters. She is also a Qualified Forensic Evaluator for the State of Hawaii.

An experienced and balanced examiner, Dr. Wittenberg is known for her clear, timely reports, responsive communication, and professional demeanor in working with attorneys, courts, and agencies. She has been qualified as an expert witness and has provided both written and oral testimony in court proceedings.
